DTU, a fully registered UKCRC Clinical Trials Unit, is one of only a handful of AROs worldwide that specialises in designing and performing cardiovascular outcome megatrials. Knowledge Mobilisation Research Fellowships (KMR Fellowships) are designed to support a balance of innovative knowledge mobilisation and research into the processes and impacts of such innovation. Through innovative practice and systematic study of that practice KMR Fellows should advance knowledge and understanding about research use, influence and impact. In order to support partnership working between Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and publicly funded healthcare bodies (NHS organisations or other publicly funded organisations providing health or social care services, for example social enterprises or local authorities), applications must be supported by organisations from both of these different sectors. KMR Fellowships are personal awards designed to buy out an individual's salary costs, support the development of innovative knowledge mobilisation activity, and provide the resources necessary to undertake a research investigation of that knowledge mobilisation. Because applications are welcomed from individuals currently working in either healthcare or academic organisations, the experience and competencies expected of the applicant are dependent on their background.

## NIHR Cochrane Programme Grant Scheme

**Closing date: Midday, Friday 30<sup>th</sup> September 2016**

The NIHR Cochrane Programme Grant Scheme was established to provide high quality systematic reviews that will be of direct benefit to users of the NHS in England. Expressions of Interest (EOIs) are now invited for a new round of the scheme. Successful EOIs will be invited to submit a full application. All NHS organisations and Universities in England are eligible to propose programmes, in collaboration with an appropriate Cochrane Co-ordinating Editor or Editor based in England. Around 10 awards are likely to be funded. Individual awards will be for a maximum of £420,000 over a period of three years (i.e. a maximum of £140,000 pa); this limit should include full economic costs at 80 per cent where appropriate. In all cases, the value for money of the proposal will be an important selection criterion. - provide opportunities for younger researchers who are in the early years of their research careers (this normally means that established researchers are very unlikely to receive an award).

Most of the Committee's funding comes from the Nuffield Oxford Hospitals Fund (NOHF), but in addition the Committee also managed the research funds resulting from other charitable donations. Funds are limited and awards are made on the scientific merit of the application. The OHSRC Chair is also happy to discuss the suitability of any applications.
