HEAD OF INFORMATICS

The University of Oxford Diabetes Trials Unit (DTU) is recruiting for the post of Head of Informatics to lead its Informatics Group. The postholder will be responsible for all day-to-day informatics operations within the Unit. The DTU (www.dtu.ox.ac.uk/) is a UKCRC fully-registered clinical trials unit, that specialises in performing clinical trials related to the treatment and management of diabetes and other cardiometabolic disorders. These are both early-phase and late-phase trials, including mega trials typically conducted in 30 or more countries.

Reporting directly to the DTU Director, the postholder should be a recognised authority in their field with excellent leadership and personnel management skills. The postholder will be adept at effectively communicating expectations and technical information to team members, and to stakeholders, in a clear and timely manner. They should also have significant experience of building trial databases in electronic data capture systems and extensive programming expertise. Knowledge of Good Clinical Practice and regulatory requirements in relation to informatics, and experience of writing standard operating procedures and specification documents is critical.

Going forward there is an exciting opportunity for the postholder to develop the Informatics Group in the light of new business and projected growth of the DTU trials portfolio.

BRC DIABETES AND METABOLISM RESEARCH ASSISTANT

Grade 6: £29,176 - £34,804 p.a.

An exciting opportunity has arisen for a Diabetes and Metabolism Theme Research Assistant, within the NIHR Oxford Biomedical Research Centre (BRC) Diabetes and Metabolism Theme, led by Professor Jeremy Tomlinson in the Oxford Centre for Diabetes, Endocrinology and Metabolism (OCDEM).

The Diabetes and Metabolism Theme oversees a complex portfolio of translational diabetes and metabolism research programs which are underpinned by core BRC funded infrastructure. BRC-funded core laboratory personnel support human bio-sample and tissue processing, stable isotope analysis and lipid profiling by gas chromatography mass spectrometry, human islet isolation and processing for translational science across the theme. The research theme consists of four subthemes: Translational Physiology, Therapeutics and Medical Innovation, Translational Islet and Metabolic Tissue Biology, Pancreas and Islet-Cell Transplantation and Service Innovation and Evaluation.

The postholder will have responsibility for both supporting and undertaking several key aspects of work within the lab including sample processing, DNA and RNA extraction from multiple human tissues, and optimising and implementing new techniques. They will be responsible for managing their own time and resources within the context of their role, and the requirements and objectives associated with their position. The postholder will support the work of research groups within the theme and report to the BRC Diabetes and Metabolism Theme Lab Manager.

Candidates should hold a degree in biochemistry or similar and have relevant laboratory experience. Some flexibility with respect to working hours will be needed, including occasional responsibility for out-of-hours work.

The position is full-time however applications are welcome from candidates wanting to work part-time. It is fixed-term until 31 March 2022 in the first instance and funded by the NIHR Oxford BRC.

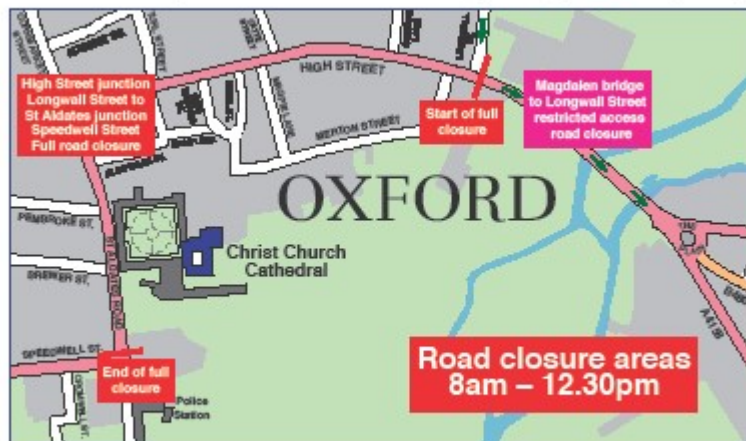

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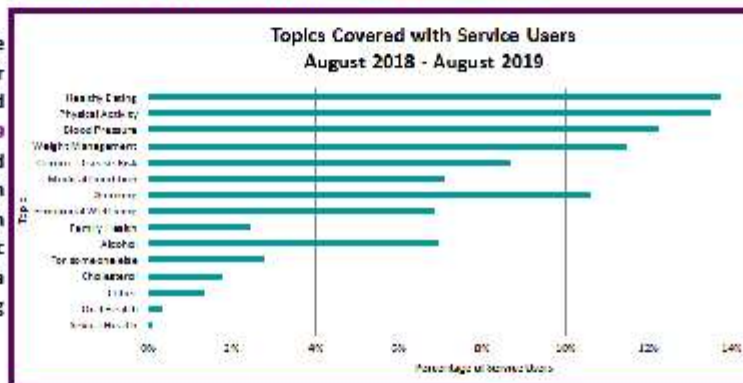
Welcome to the Autumn edition of the **Here for Health** newsletter.

Recent Activities and Developments at **Here for Health**

Demand is increasing for the **Here for Health** Service. Over the last 12 months we have had a monthly average of **319** healthy conversations compared to a monthly average of **231** in the previous year. The graph opposite highlights the holistic nature of the service with a range of lifestyle topics being covered.



Promotion stands: We are now able to offer weekly promotion stands at both the JR and Churchill Hospitals every Thursday morning. They provide opportunity for staff, patients and visitors to have their blood pressure checked, talk to a member of the team about their health and wellbeing and find out more about what the **Here for Health** service can offer them. It is also a fantastic opportunity for us to work in partnership with other OUH departments and community services to help raise awareness of the support they can offer and to promote key lifestyle topics and national health promotion campaigns.
