

The University

Oxford is the oldest university in the English-speaking world, and a leader in learning, teaching and research. It is a collegiate University, consisting of the central University and colleges. We have been ranked number one in the world for medicine for two years running by the Times Higher Education Supplement (2011-12 and 2012-13). Oxford is also ranked in the top ten globally in life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences and the arts and humanities. Students from more than 140 countries and territories make up a student population of over 21,000. The Radcliffe Department of Medicine (RDM)

One of 16 departments of the MSD

The Radcliffe Department of Medicine (RDM), is a large multi-disciplinary department with research interests that span the translational spectrum, from basic biological research through to clinical application. The department has internationally renowned programmes in a broad range of sciences related to medicine, ranging from cardiovascular, diabetes, endocrinology, and stroke research, to molecular medicine, immunology, haematology and pathology, including programmes in stem cell & regenerative medicine. RDM is led by Prof Hugh Watkins and currently has 500 employees, and an annual turnover of around £45M. The RDM Divisions

RDM also has 5 Divisions namely: Cardiovascular Medicine (CVM), Investigative Medicine Division (IMD), Nuffield Division of Clinical Laboratory Sciences (NDCLS) and the Oxford Centre for Diabetes, Endocrinology and Metabolism (OCDEM). Many staff associated with NDCLS and IMD will be based in the MRC Weatherall Institute of Molecular Medicine (WIMM). The constituent parts of the Department maintain their own identity and have substantially devolved administration but collaboration across the parts is close and productive with joint sponsorship of major projects. <http://www.rdm.ox.ac.uk/about-rdm>
