The E.P. Abraham Cephalosporin Fund

Erasmus Staff Training

Aim: To encourage student and staff mobility for study and work, and to promote co-operation amongst universities across Europe. Training may be job shadowing, observation, attendance at workshops or courses. Staff can approach the institution of their choice.

Funding is available to support: Staff training and contributions towards subsistence and travel.

Duration of funding: Between 2 and 7 days. Priority is given to members of staff going abroad for the first time.

Eligibility: All staff at Oxford.

John Fell Fund (JFF)

Amount: small award scheme (< £7.5k) or main award scheme (> £7.5k with no upper limit).

Oxford-UCB Prize Fellowship in Biomedical Research

Aim: These fellowships are aimed at both researchers and clinicians. Combines scientific excellence with the chance to make a significant difference for patients.

Research areas: Epilepsy, Inflammation, Neurodegeneration, Neuroinflammation, Immunomodulation, Fibrosis, Metabolic disease and disorders affecting Bone and/or Cartilage.

Funding is available to support: salary, consumables, travel. £10k towards fellow's professional development. Student fees are covered for Clinical Fellows that wish to undertake a DPhil.

Duration of funding: 3 years.

Eligibility: Post-doc fellows must not have more than 3 years' post-doc experience. Clinical Research Fellows must be GMC registered, have prior research experience (typically a BSc), some specialist experience, typically having obtained MRCP or equivalent, but not CCT or consultant status.

Medical Research Fund (MRF)

Funding is available in 3 streams:

- 1) **Bridging funding:** supports salary costs (typically 3 months) pending the application of an externally submitted grant. Applications will only be funded if the external research grant "promotes work in the field of **medical research**" (a grant application to the BBSRC or Leverhulme Trust may not count as medical research). In addition, funding can be requested to support maternity/shared parental/adoption leave costs for researchers.
- 2) **Pump priming:** enables investigators to obtain pilot data to support larger scale applications for external research funding in the future (<£10k). **Postdocs are eligible to apply as the PI** an ideal opportunity to secure some funding in their own name.
- 3) **Clinical pre-fellowship:** provides short-term (up to 3 months) funding to cover the salary costs of clinicians who will shortly begin an externally funded research training fellowship at Oxford.

applications. Please note that applications to support maternity/shared parental/adoption leave are not included in the cap of 5 applications per department.

External Fellowship Funding Opportunities

Coordination of Fellowships in RDM

RDM has a process to coordinate and support all fellowship applications* being submitted. This process ensures applicants, (1) receive equal support with their application, irrespective of the RDM division they are based in, and (2) benefit from the extensive expertise within RDM, across a broad range of funding bodies.

This process is co-ordinated by <u>Dr Ruth McCaffrey</u>, RDM Research Strategy Coordinator:

- Anyone wishing to apply for a fellowship must notify Ruth as early as possible and
 provide a summary of their proposed research and a copy of their CV. A minimum of
 3 months in advance of the funder's deadline is advised; the earlier you inform us, the
 more support we can provide.
- A group of senior PIs in RDM will provide feedback on the strength of the CV and the
 proposed research, which will be anonymised and fed back to the applicant. We hope
 applicants find this advice useful and take it on board. It will then be up to the
 applicant (and supervisor or sponsor, where relevant) to decide whether to proceed
 with the application.
- Each applicant will then be given an advisor (a PI in RDM who is familiar with the funder, where possible) who will provide support and proof read the application.
- Each applicant will be put in contact with other holders of the fellowship they are applying for, both within RDM and the wider Medical Sciences Division. If an Oxford PI sits on the fellowship review panel, we will seek their input, where appropriate.
- Where needed, a letter of support from the Head of Department will be provided.
- If an applicant is invited for an interview, Ruth will organise a mock interview.

You are required to notify Ruth of (1) your intention to submit an application and (2) the outcome of your application. The support being offered is optional, but we hope that everyone will consider availing of it, to ensure they submit the strongest proposal possible.

BHF Translational Awards

The <u>BHF Translational Awards</u> are aimed at supporing the pre-clinical development of new cardiovascular medicines and technologies so that they are attractive for follow-on funding. This used to be an open call, but has now changed to two application rounds per year:

- October 2016 round: 20th October (preliminary application), 8th March 2017 (full application).
