Changes to Internal Funding

The Medical Sciences Division has introduced some changes to internal funding opportunities.

Medical Sciences Internal Fund (MSIF) – NEW

The Medical Research Fund (MRF), The Goodger and Schorstein Scholarship and the Wellcome Trust Institutional Strategic Support Fund (ISSF), have been combined into a single new fund: the <u>Medical Sciences Internal Fund (MSIF)</u>.

The MSIF currently has three funding streams:

- 1) Bridging salary scheme provides short-term funding to cover salary costs, essentially replacing the MRF bridging funding scheme. Support is also available to cover the costs associated with research staff who take maternity/shared parental/adoption leave (family leave) whilst employed on an externally funded research grant.
- **2) Pump priming funding scheme** provides small awards (<£10k) to enable investigators to obtain pilot data to support larger scale applications for external research funding in the future, essentially replacing the MRF pump priming scheme. Applications are accepted from MSD PIs, postdoctoral researchers, postdoctoral clinical lecturers and clinical research fellows.
- **3)** Clinical pre-fellowship scheme provides short-term funding to cover the salary costs of clinicians who will shortly begin an externally funded research training fellowship at Oxford.

Please see the section below for full details on the 3 funding streams.

In addition, for the next round of applications (deadline in January 2017) further funding opportunities will be available via the MSIF:

- Larger awards of <£100k. A match of 20% will be required for these applications.
- Interdepartmental Strategic Initiatives awards of up to £200k to support strategic equipment, research assets or staff within shared facilities or to establish cross-cutting themes through e.g. research facilitation, symposia.

Details of these awards will be circulated as soon as they become available from the Medical Sciences Divisional office.

The MSIF will have 3 deadlines per year (1 per term). **RDM will set an internal deadline for all** applications to the MSIF which will be approximately 10 days in advance of the MSIF deadline. See below for details on the internal deadlines.

Please note that Departments are capped in the number of applications they can submit for bridging salary support (applications for family leave are not included in this cap). **Each department can submit a maximum of 15 bridging funding applications in a year.** Please note that there are no deadlines for submission of applications for family leave - <u>see Bridging and Family Leave section</u> for further information.

John Fell Fund – change in eligibility

Previously departments had to rank all applications they submitted to the John Fell Fund. This is no longer required. Instead of providing rankings, departments are encouraged to assess whether all applications submitted in a given round have a high priority for funding, as multiple applications from a department are essentially competing with each other. For this reason, **RDM** will continue to set an earlier internal deadline for JFF applications, so that applications can be reviewed by a panel of RDM PIs and only the strongest applications submitted. See below for details on the internal deadlines.

The guidance for applications to the JFF has been clarified to make clear that senior postdoctoral researchers who are genuinely on an independent career track (planning to submit external fellowship applications) are now eligible to be the lead applicant on JFF applications. You will need to discuss this with Ruth McCaffrey or Serena Briant well in advance of applying, as a letter of support from the Head of Department will be required.

Internal Fund Webpages

The MSD Internal Fund webpages have been updated in order to make the internal funding process easier to navigate for both researchers and departments.

RDM Deadlines for Internal Funds

There is an RDM deadline for all applications to the John Fell Fund and the Medical Sciences Internal Fund (excluding family leave). These internal deadlines allow time to review applications, provide feedback, and to add value. Applications that are prepared in good time and receive feedback can be strengthened and are more likely to be successful.

RDM will continue to convene a panel of PIs to review applications to the JFF. In addition, we will also convene a panel of PIs to review all applications to the MSIF.

RDM deadlines will be approximately 10 days in advance of the deadlines for internal funds. These deadlines will be strictly enforced. Please refer to the Funding Bulletins to find out the dates of RDM deadlines or contact <u>Dr Serena Briant</u> if you have any queries.

Internal Funding Opportunities

Returning Carers' Fund

Aim: Funding to support the development of research careers following a break to care for a child or close relative.

Funding is available to support: 1) Teaching buy-out to enable you to concentrate on research; 2) training or professional development; 3) short-term secondments to enable you to 'get up to speed' with recent research; 4) conference attendance to enable you to re-establish your profile; 5) short-term research or admin assistance; 6) small scale lab equipment purchase; 7) funding visits to Oxford by your recent collaborator. This list is not exhaustive and any reasonable applications will be considered providing the link to career development in scientific research can be demonstrated.

Eligibility: All those who: are currently on leave for a min. of six months; have returned from a break of at least six months within the last two years; or have returned from two breaks each of at least six months within the last five years. A break may comprise two or more discontinuous periods of leave totalling at least six months provided that they relate to a single life event, eg. as part of a shared parental leave arrangement.

MRC Discovery Award start-up grant

Aim: Development of pre-clinical studies in **genome editing of haematopoietic stem cells** (see webpage for key topic areas).

Funding is available to support: Consumables, staff (12 months max. and employment contract finishing no later than 28/02/2018), small equipment (under £10K) – each application should request between £25k to £100k. Note that funding is **not** intended to support continuation of normal research grants, research directed at generating or validating preliminary data for a 'follow-on' grant from already established lines of enquiry, admin costs, bridging funds, PhD studentships, capital or infrastructure.

Eligibility: Be part of a research group in the Oxford Medical Sciences Division.

John Fell Fund (JFF)

Funding to support: (a) pump priming, (b) early career researcher, (c) other academic activities likely to lead to new research initiatives, (d)



Research Facilitators, (e) support related to bids for external funding, (f) strategic investment in research assets.

Amount: small award scheme (< £7.5k) or main award scheme (> £7.5k with no upper limit).

This earlier internal deadline will be *strictly applied* as a group of PIs from across RDM will be convened to review applications.

Medical Sciences Internal Fund (MSIF)

Funding is available for:

- 1) Pump priming: enables investigators to obtain pilot data to support larger scale applications for external research funding in the future (<£10k). Postdocs are eligible to apply as the PI an ideal opportunity to secure some funding in their own name.
- 2) **Clinical pre-fellowship:** provides short-term (up to 3 months) funding to cover the salary costs of clinicians who will shortly begin an externally funded research training fellowship at Oxford.
- 3) **Bridging and family leave:** Bridging funding supports salary costs (typically 3 months) pending the application of an externally submitted grant.

To be eligible to apply researchers must: 1) Be externally funded and bridging to another external grant; 2) not be bridging from startup packages regardless of funding source; 3) not be bridging to non-medical research, e.g. BBSRC or Leverhulme funding. There is a cap of 15 applications submitted by the whole department per year.

In addition, funding can be requested to support maternity/shared parental/adoption leave bridging costs for researchers whilst employed on an externally funded research grant.

Applications to support this type of bridging are not included in the cap of 15 applications per department.

External Fellowship Funding Opportunities

Coordination of Fellowships in RDM

RDM has a process to coordinate and support all fellowship applications* being submitted. This process ensures applicants, (1) receive equal support with their application, irrespective of the RDM division they are based in, and (2) benefit from the extensive expertise within RDM, across a broad range of funding bodies.

This process is co-ordinated by <u>Dr Ruth McCaffrey</u>, RDM Research Strategy Coordinator:

- Anyone wishing to apply for a fellowship must notify Ruth as early as possible and
 provide a summary of their proposed research and a copy of their CV. A minimum of
 3 months in advance of the funder's deadline is advised; the earlier you inform us, the
 more support we can provide.
- A group of senior PIs in RDM will provide feedback on the strength of the CV and the
 proposed research, which will be anonymised and fed back to the applicant. We hope
 applicants find this advice useful and take it on board. It will then be up to the
 applicant (and supervisor or sponsor, where relevant) to decide whether to proceed
 with the application.
- Each applicant will then be given an advisor (a PI in RDM who is familiar with the funder, where possible) who will provide support and proof read the application.
- Each applicant will be put in contact with other holders of the fellowship they are applying for, both within RDM and the wider Medical Sciences Division. If an Oxford PI sits on the fellowship review panel, we will seek their input, where appropriate.
- Where needed, a letter of support from the Head of Department will be provided.
- If an applicant is invited for an interview, Ruth will organise a mock interview.

You are required to notify Ruth of (1) your intention to submit an application and (2) the outcome of your application. The support being offered is optional, but we hope that everyone will consider availing of it, to ensure they submit the strongest proposal possible.




